AAH Statistics

Program Brochure

Adopt-A-Highway (AAH) is an innovitive program developed by the lows Department of Transportation (DOT) to increase public asserances of environmental noods along lows highways by making soctions of roadelides available for "adoption." This gives the adopting individuals groups opportunities to improve the appearance of our roadsides throughout the state

Activities may include litter removal, and plant-ing and/or maintenance of trees, shrubs, wild-flowers, and native grasses. Other activities are cligible with approval from the department.

Seeds may be harvested and used to plant other public lands. However, seeds harvested on public lands cannot be sold.

Highway adoptions can be used to make the entrance or gateway to a community more inviting, and offer a proud welcome.

The AAH program allows individuals or groups The Aux program anover individuals of groups to do one or more eligible activities on a seg-ment of highway. These activities can reduce litter along highways, enhance the environment, beautify roadsides, and build broad-based community support or anti-litter and highway beautification programs. New ideas on how to beautify our roadsides are encouraged.

a group or an individual may only adopt one entryway to a community.

Caring for roadsides will not only make them more attractive to the traveling public, but will also make major improvements in our environ-

Grassy roadsides provide habitat for ground nosting birds such as pheasants, quait, mead-owlarks, and many other song birds.



Roadsides also provide excellent habitat for other wildlife. Many roadside plantings provide a source of tood for wildlife.

Property owners may wish to adopt sections adjoining their land and will be given the first opportunity to do so. Second proteorous is given to governing bodies of small communities and urban areae. Final preference will be given to organizations, clubs and individuals.

Adoptions will not be allowed for political can-Adoptions will not be allowed for political can-didates, elected officials or entities that would constitute partisan endorsements. Any orga-nization or individual whose sponsorship may have an adverse effect on the program is also ineligible.

Groupe or individuals adopting sections of highway will be responsible for that roadside for a minimum of two years. Litter removal must be done at least twice a year or as necessary to keep the area clean. Litter pickup on primary roads must include both sides of the highway. Interstate highway litter pickup will be on one side of the highway.

Litter removal is automatically included in every Adopt-A-Highway sponsorship, even if the main project may be landscaping or another activity.

In addition to litter pickup and beautification projects, adopting groups may also control noxious weeds by using lowa DOT-approved methods, which may include hand weeding.

A minimum distance for adoption is one-half mile for special project work. However, adoption of at least two miles is required for litter pickup. Smaller sections may be permissible on slub roules or unusual sections of highway.

While working along a highway can be fun, safety of workers is a priority. Adopting orga-nizations are required to hold safety meetings before work begins. Participants 14 years of age or younger should have adequate adult

Participants must also wear high-visibility safety vests when working on the highway right of way. Vosts and orango trash bags will be turnished by the lowe DOT.

For the safety of persons picking up litter, do not pick up large objects or anything on or within 10 feet of the pavement. Picking up litter from the medians is not allowed. If aponarse ancounter anything they regard as hezardous, they chould not pick it up, but should notify the lowe DOT.



The sponsor must be willing to separate ma sponsor must be willing to soparate litter according to the requirements of the landfill used by the local lowe DOT maintenance ga-rage. The sponsor may retain any recyclables and take them to a recyclar of the sponsor's choice.



Signs featuring our state flower, the wild rose, will be erected by the lowa DOT at no cost to the sponsor to recognize the efforts of adopting groups or individu-als. In areas with many signs or very rough terrain, AAH signing may not be possible.

A sign indicating the sponsor's name may be ordered through the AAH representative for the back of this brochure.)



Signing is not a requirement for AAH sponsor-ships. Sponsors may elect to adopt a highway section without signing.


Through this program, adopting groups of indi-viduals will gain recognition for themselves and build a positive image for the state.
